Accompany: to go along with or join in

Allegro: to play a piece in a quick & lively manner

Alternating: to change back and forth, or take turns

Beat: the steady pulse of music

Composer: someone who writes or creates music

Conductor: someone who directs a musical group

Copy: to do what I do

<u>Duet</u>: two musicians performing together

Echo: to copy

Ensemble: a group of people singing or playing together

Forte & Piano: Italian words for loud & soft

Improvise: to make music up on the spot

Largo: a very slow tempo

Lullaby: songs that we sing softly at bedtime

Melody: a sequence of notes that make up a tune or a theme

<u>Music Staff</u>: the lines and spaces that show where music notes are written

<u>Pattern</u>: a sequence or series of sounds or pictures

<u>Percussion</u>: a family of instruments played by shaking or being struck with hands or a mallet

<u>Pitch</u>: the high or low quality of a sound

Repeat: to do, make, or perform again

Rhyme: words that sound the same

Rhythm: the pattern of sounds in a song; the way the words go

Solo: someone singing or playing music alone

Steps & Leaps: the way notes move in a melody

Tempo: the speed of music

Voice: our vocal instrument — speak, sing, shout & whisper.
